Application Procedure

Prospective incoming The partner university (home HEI) selects students according to performance, commitment and language skills and nominates them for the exchange semester st

commitment and language skills and nominates them for the exchange semester stay via e-mail to the incoming students' coordinator of EMÜ at <u>erasmusin@emu.ee</u>. The nomination should contain student's name and surname, field of study, date of birth, e-mail address and duration of mobility. After receiving the nomination the coordinator at EMÜ will contact the student and instruct him/her of the following procedures, that are available <u>here</u>. Students need to submit their applications online <u>here</u>. Together with the application, a transcript of records, a certificate proving their level of English is at least B2 and a copy of their passport must be submitted.

EMÜ does not require originals of these documents, copies are enough.

Course registration and Academic Information

Language Proficiency	We require all international students to have at least a B2 level of English language proficiency and this must be proven with a language certificate (doesn't need to be a TOEFL or IELTS certificate, a certificate released by the home university is enough).
Language courses	We offer basic courses of Estonian language for foreigners (2 ECTS credits) during the semester.



Semester Workload	Exchange students are required to take courses for at least 15 ECTS per semester. There is no maximum limit.
Academic Transcripts	The incoming students' coordinator prepares and hands the transcript of records to the student in the end of semester. It is the student's responsibility to receive it at the Office of Academic Affairs before departure from EMÜ.

CampusAll exchange students can get a place in the Torn dormitory which is located on campus.Students are responsible for booking a place/room for himself/herself. He/she must do the booking
via the web-page_ in July for Autumn semester and in December/January for Spring semester.

Health care

International students (exept PhD students) studying in Estonia are not covered by Estonian Health Insurance Fund (Haigekassa), unless they are employed in Estonia or have the right of permanent residence or a long-term residence permit. Thus, you need to ensure that you have some other health insurance for your period of study in Estonia (EU residents, bring your European Health Insurance Card).

Visa Requirements

Entry Regulations

Applicants from EU, EEA and Schengen area do not need visa to study in Estonia. All non-EU citizens need a visa to study in Estonia. In order to get a visa a student needs to apply for it at the embassy or consulate of Estonia in your home country or in the nearest <u>representative office</u>. It is necessary to apply at least 2 months ahead of time.

Residence Permit/Right of Residence

Right of Residence (EU partners)	 All the Citizens of the member states of the European Union and the European Economic Area and the Swiss Confederation who come to Estonia for a period longer than 3 months need to apply for the Right of Residence. The following steps have to be made right after arriving in Estonia: register as a resident of Tartu at the Population Register Office (Küüni St. 5) go to the Migration Bureau and apply for an identity card which certifies your right of temporary residence. D-visa (non-EU partners)	All non-EU students who are staying in Estonia for more than three months are required to apply for a long-term (D) visa . The student must submit the D-visa application in person in the nearest Estonian Embassy – either in their home country or abroad. Please see the list of Estonian Embassies handling visa applications <u>here</u> . Students coming for a stay that is shorter than 90 days, can use visa free access if they are citizens of countries listed <u>here</u> .

Before leaving

At the end of the semester, the incoming students' coordinator will prepare the transcript of records for all the students. Before leaving, it is the student's responsibility to come to the International Relations office to receive the transcript of records and confirmation of stay.

The International Office appreciates it if the students fill the feedback form, which is sent to them before the end of the semester.
